As my three-year term as Chair of this great Foundation comes to an end, I would like to thank the board members and volunteers that I have served with for their support, engagement and unequaled passion to push forward for growth and awareness of our mission.

My sincere thanks go out to our generous sponsors and many donators that have contributed to our cause. I also thank the IAMI organization for their ongoing commitment to the success of the Foundation.

I am proud of the accomplishments that have been implemented during my tenure. We have taken the Foundation from a "start-up" to one that is growing both as a fund-raising and giving organization. Key highlights:

- **Board Structure.** The number and roles on our board of directors has grown as we have grown. We now have a dedicated Treasurer where this was previously a position shared with CSIFT.
- **Governance.** The bylaws were updated to give us more flexibility on the size of our board. We've created a process for securing new board members along with recruiting for specific skills and talents.
- Giving Strategy. A common passion for each member of the leadership team is growing our giving by
 focusing on how we can build awareness of the science of food and provide scholarships. This year we
 added the Freshman Scholarship and several board members participated in awareness programs at area
 schools.
- Marketing Materials. I want to also call out the work of our Marketing Committee as they have developed a flyer, a folder, this annual report, and created a new website. We also created several new logos—one of which is the Proud Sponsor logo!
- **Finance & Audit.** The Finance and Audit Committee members have focused on establishing and improving internal controls, managing investments, and hiring a new tax and audit firm. The first formal independent audit was completed for the 2019-20 fiscal year and we are proud of the results indicating that our practices are in good order.

As the world leaned how to function within the parameters of COVID-19, so too did CFSF. Our fund-raising efforts were affected with the limitation on large gatherings. We are thankful that we've still been able to hold our annual golf outing.

Going forward, an increased effort needs to be on fund-raising strategies including a corporate campaign. I plan to continue with my involvement and to support the Foundation in the years ahead.

The 2021 Competitive Scholarship Program saw 47 applicants from 10 schools.

CFSF recently provided donations to the University of Illinois, Illinois Institute of Technology, and Dominican University in the form of travel grants so their students could attend Chicago Section IFT events where they not only gain knowledge on different food science related topics, but also provide the opportunity to network with food industry professionals.





In 2020, 2 students were each awarded \$2,500 scholarships to study food science.





EXPENDING YOUR HORIZONS—CHICAGO

2020-2021 Committee Reports

Auditing Committee

The Auditing Committee got off to a running start last fall. A task force was created with members from the CSIFT and CFSF organizations to explore the potential opportunity to replace the current accounting firm.

The objective of the task force was to search for accounting firms that have experience and familiarity with the accounting practices for 501(c)(3) organizations. The team did a thorough job and met their project timeline. Ultimately, the task force made a recommendation to hire a new accounting firm.

Committee Chair CPA Debbie Schodrof and IAMI deserve a ton of thanks and kudos for all of the time spent on getting our books aligned. We are thrilled to say from an accounting perspective we are in the best shape we have ever been in.

Finance Committee

The Board was excited to welcome our new Treasurer, Michael Gross. Due to a proposal made to CSIFT in 2019, the treasurer responsibilities between CSIFT and CFSF have been separated. Michael will be solely focused on CFSF activities. CSIFT has their own Treasurer. Prior to this change, there was one treasurer for both organizations. In conforming to best practices this change was implemented.

The Finance committee led the initiative to poll the Board to understand the risk tolerance that the Board is willing to take in planning out the Giving and Investing strategy. Understanding the fenceposts to operate in the Finance Committee will develop a ladder-type investment strategy. These fenceposts will also help establish how many scholarships can be granted with limits on what can be used from the monies that are in investment funds.

A budget was developed and approved by the Board. There is a clause included which is tied to our fundraising efforts. Prior to the Scholarship application date opening in February, the Board will review the year to date fundraising revenue results to understand how many scholarships can be granted.

The contract of our valued partner IAMI was up for renewal. Previously, a three (3) contract was in place. Due to the challenges of COVID-19, and with the agreement of CSIFT, a one (1) contract was put in place, with the contract expiration date 31 May 2022.

CFSF was established through an endowment by CSIFT. CSIFT's revenue was very negatively affected with the cancellation of the annual Suppliers' event. CFSF has stepped up to assume a higher percentage of the IAMI expense for the upcoming year to help alleviate the expense burden from CSIFT as well as maintaining the expected service level needed from IAMI.

Development / Fund-Raising Committee

The Development team had to create new ways to reach out (and touch from a socially safe distance) to our supporters as we dealt with the challenges that COVID-19 has had on society's personal health and economic well-being. We were teetering on the edge of not being able to hold our largest

fundraiser event with the Annual Golf Outing. As the state of IL was in a phased shut down mode, we needed to determine if we could safely do this. Normally, the event is in August. We made the decision in May to have the event in October.

While the attendance was not at typical levels due to travel restrictions with COVID-19, we were very pleased with the outcome. Instead of reserving all 4 courses at Cog Hill, we had the attendance to fill 2 of the 4 courses. The net income for the event was at a level from 2018. The committee has decided to have the 2021 Golf outing in September with the hopes of participation being at 2019 levels.

The November CSIFT Supplier's Expo was held as a virtual event with the MN Section. During the virtual conference we conducted our Online Silent Auction. Through the generosity of suppliers and private donors we had some unique lots for online bidding. This effort netted us nearly \$5000.00.

We were not able to have the pre-expo party like we did in 2019 but look forward to CSIFT having a Suppliers' event this November. Being optimistic that CSIFT will be able to host a Suppliers' event we will plan on going forward with a Tuesday night fundraising gathering in the Rosemont area.

In January, for the first time we launched an Individual Campaign. While we did not get the donations, we were hoping for we are confident that this effort has helped increase awareness of the Foundation within the food industry.

The Development committee is developing the tools and materials to pursue a campaign to increase corporate sponsorship. We will not only look to be more aggressive in pursuing corporate sponsorship, we will be pursuing corporate donations that look to sponsor scholarships. The goal is to launch this campaign in the fall of 2021.

There has been a recognized need to get a board member that has fund raising experience. The callout for new board members is specifically worded for an individual with those skills. We desperately need someone to lead and coordinate all of the fundraising efforts. This includes events, campaigns, sponsorships, etc.

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2020-2021 Committee Reports

Giving Committee

The Giving Committee is the best committee to be a part of as we are responsible for identifying and recommending giving opportunities. We also get to review all of the fantastic Competitive Scholarship Program applications.

As much of the content of this annual report shares how we have delivered on our mission and vision to raise awareness of the science of food and providing scholarships, we'd like to share some details on specific programs we've supported and our vision for the future.



IFT Educator Program – IFT created a program to bring educators to the National IFT Conference annually. This day-long event introduces educators to Food Science, careers in the food industry, and experiments they can use in their classrooms.

Kantha Shelke and Linda Perucca, two CFSF Board Members, were two of the three main presenters at this year's virtual event. Guest speakers from Chicago Section IFT represented different careers in the food industry and spoke about their positions.

There were 112 educators attending the event who teach over 25,000 students. CFSF provided a \$75 gift card to the first 100 teachers that registered and attended for supplies to do food science experiments in the classrooms. We are proud to say that we are helping bringing Food Science to 100 classrooms across the state of Illinois!



4-H Food Science Projects – 4-H is an America's largest youth development organization. Across the US it empowers over 6 million young people ages 10-18 with skills to lead for a lifetime. During the 4-H program, youth learn about different areas of study that could turn into a career.

4-H creates projects on what they have learned to take to the local county fairs. They have a Food Science project where kids learn about the role of gluten in baking, how different leavening agents work in bakery products, what chemical reactions happen when eggs are cooked and much more.

As an incentive to get youth to try the Food Science project and get exposed to what is Food Science, CFSF sponsored a \$50 prize in 54 counties across Illinois to the top Food Science project in each county. Additionally, Board Member Linda Perucca presented a virtual workshop on experiments for the first year of the Food Science projects.



Expanding Your Horizons – Expanding Your Horizons is a program designed for girls in Elementary and Middle School (6-8 grades). The program is designed to spark an interest in STEM activities and careers. They are guided by the understanding that engaging with female STEM role models and participating in hands -on STEM activities can help girls begin to see themselves pursuing STEM careers.

CFSF donated \$1,000 towards the EYH annual workshop and Board members, Maddie Gerling, Upasana Hariram, Linda Perucca, Laura Saran, and Kantha Shelke participated in two different tracks during the 2021 virtual event.

One track was called "All about texture" where students learned about how texture is created in different foods. The second track was called "Food: Edible Science and Fun" where students learned about the chemical and physical reactions that occur while preparing food. The student got to convert liquid whipping cream into a semi-solid ice cream through science.

GROWING OUR GIVING—LOOKING TO 2022

Help us to Grow our Giving – CFSF is constantly looking for new programs to support that meet our mission of inspiring all ages to be engaged in the science of food. As we head to our new fiscal year, we have some new areas we want to develop.

We ask for your support of CFSF as a sponsor to help continue our amazing programs and create new ones to bring awareness of Food Science Careers. Through your help we will build a strong pipeline of talented Food Science Professionals.



Chicago High School for Agricultural Sciences (CHSAS) – While we supported individual students with college scholarships in 2020, we would like to grow our relationship by organizing a "Food Science Day" in the spring of 2022. The goal is to raise awareness of Food Science as a degree / career to freshmen students before they select their pathway.

Additionally, this event would allow current Food Science Pathway students a chance to interact with food industry professional and learn about the variety of careers within the food industry. CHSAS is a college preparatory high school on Chicago's south side that provides opportunities for diverse students from across the city of Chicago to study agriculture with the goal of developing marketable skills as well as college level competencies.



FFA – FFA is the premier youth organization preparing members for leadership and careers in the science, business, and technology of agriculture. They have Food Science as a Career Pathway where we are looking at a few engagement opportunities.

The first area we will probably get engaged with them would be to participate in their Illinois Association of Vocational Agriculture Teachers Conference (IAVAT) and have Food Science be a part of the breakout workshops.

The second area is a Food Science and Technology Career Development Event (CDE) at the state level where student compete both as an individual and team to test their Food Science, Food Safety and Sensory knowledge. They also work as teams to develop a new product to respond to a market need. Winning teams would go on to compete at the national level. In the future as funds become available, we might help sponsor teams to compete.



Pilot Light – Pilot Light is a non-for-profit Organization whose mission is to support students as they learn and advocate for informed choices by bridging the lessons they learn in their classrooms to the food on their lunch trays, at home and in their communities.

The thought is to integrate some food science and nutrition information into their curriculum. The first area we will probably get engaged with them would be to participate in their Illinois Association of Vocational Agriculture Teachers Conference (IAVAT) and have Food Science be a part of the breakout workshops.

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2020-2021 Committee Reports

Governance Committee

The Governance Committee continues to contribute to the ongoing structure of the Foundation and strengthen its policies for the future. A series of proposals to the board have been approved. These proposals brought forward to the Board were developed from a committee that includes representation from CSIFT.

Succession Planning. The bylaws have been updated to allow for a co-chair position that would shadow the current chair in the 3rd year of the chair's tenure. The co-chair would then naturally succeed to the chair position, no vote would be needed.

Extending Board Member Term. At the end of an elected 3-year term, an individual can petition for extending their current term for an additional (I) year. Petition to be approved by the board. At the end of additional year, the position would be opened for election. This includes the individual leaving said position.

CSIFT Board Representation. The committee presented to the CSIFT Executive Committee to reduce the amount of representation of the CFSF Board from 4 members to 3. This proposal was accepted. The CSIFT representation on the CFSF board at the start of the 2021 2022 year will include the Chair, Past Chair and Secretary. This reduction in CSIFT Board representation will allow the CFSF board to recruit for needed skills and talents and keep the working board to a manageable level.

Bylaws Update. The proposal to amend Section 1.1.4 of the bylaws regarding removal of a board member was accepted. This addition was made to the section; "A director may resign at any time by providing written notice of resignation to the Secretary or, in the case of the resignation of the Secretary, to the Chair.

A director who is absent from three consecutive meetings of the Foundation Board of Directors shall, unless such absences are excused by the affirmative act of the Foundation Board of Directors, be deemed to have resigned from the Foundation Board of Directors and from any office held.
